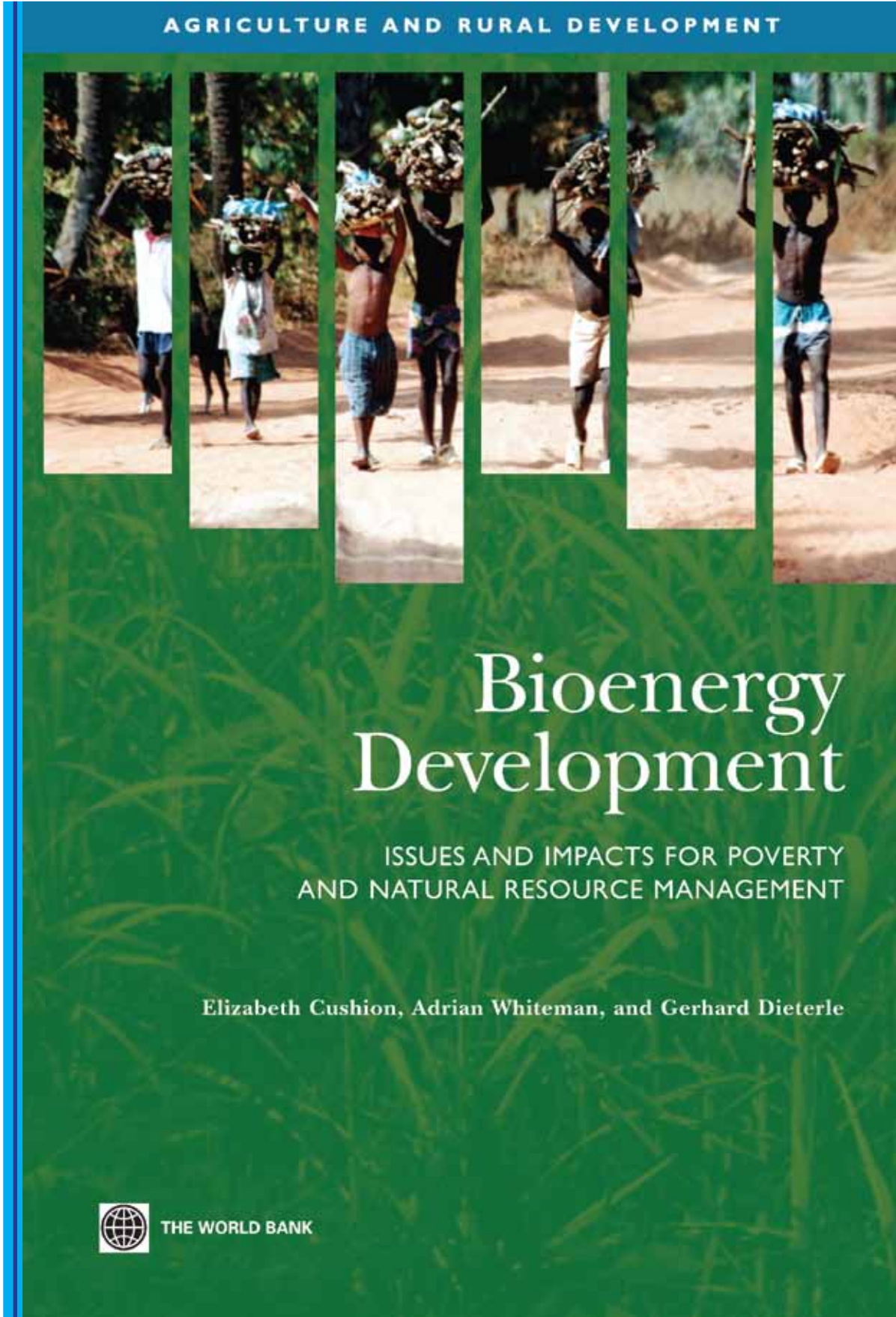


Bioenergy Development
